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SUBHASISM IS THE FUTURE

The 19th Party Congress of the All India Forward Bloc concluded successfully at Hyderabad from 23rd to 26th February 2023, with a tribute to the lost talents and revolutionary stars. Debabrata Biswas garlanded the statue of Netaji placed in the dais. Com. Debabrata Biswas made the initial address. While addressing the delegates Com. Biswas came down heavily on the anti people policies of the BJP government and opined that the left and democratic forces should unite to ensure the defeat of BJP in the ensuing election of 2024. The leaders of left parties addressed the delegates and

univocally opined that whatever may be the strength of the left parties in the Parliament, the credibility of the left parties are still intact. Therefore this credibility is to be utilized to rally other left secular forces together to form a people’s alternative. Subhashini Ali Ex MP, Polit Bureau member of CPM, Dr. K. Narayana, secretary of CPI Central Committee, N.K. Premachandran M.P,

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We cannot afford any separatist movement further more. The Khalistan movement is a Sikh separatist movement seeking to create a homeland for Sikhs by establishing sovereign state Khalistan. We, as the people of India or from the Government's part cannot afford to the idea of an Independent Khalistan. We firmly believe that the country is a secular democracy and that the creation of separate Sikh state would be violation of India's territorial integrity and sovereignty. This is a sensitive issue and has the potential to impact national calm and security, Obsession with 'Khalistan' idea that was defeated more than three decades ago, once again seethes with little support of Sikh diaspora. But the effort has little impact in the state as the people of Punjab are not ready to face such obsession further more.

Khalistani activists are seen active and the incidents of denigration of the Indian flag and vandalising of Indian diplomatic missions came to light. The Sikh diaspora or a very small section of it has sympathy with such idea. In Punjab there is no any support, despite there number of

problems related with agriculture amid shrinking landholding, declining possibility of job generation, addiction to alcohol and drugs in the young population and so on. Infact people of the state are well aware of the fact that Khalistan has no

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any answer to above mentioned issues. The cross-border support to terrorism is always ready to support but the people want no repeat of the violence that raged in the state in the 1980s and continued up to the mid-1990s. At that time armed uprising by Sikh militants fuelled by Pakistan's ISI. We all know that It was Punjab's youth that paid the highest price and most of the people have not forgotten that blood-shed and horror.

Appearance of the mysterious Waris Punjab De, the self-styled leader or chief of this outfit Amritpal

Singh is creating trouble. In London Khalistani activists replaced the Tricolons at the Indian High Commission with their own flag, the vandalism at the Indian consulate in San Fancisco, and the protests in Canada leading to the cancellation of the Indian envoy's participation in an event, is enough to assess this problem again and the activeness of khalistan supporters.

Sikh community settled abroad are mostly not with such obsessions but there are some who are trying to ignite this idea that was politically defeated years before. Sikhs are aware of the situations.

India is correct to demand action against such groups and we hope so as broad minded, multi-cultural democracies are matured in US, Canada and Britain and anti-India views and operations must be checked by these nations. Search for Amritpal Singh has been extended to other states. He may cross to Nepal or LOC or any other way. People are ready to crush such separatist move. But from the part of politicians they must address the vital problems facing the state and the tranquility of state must be preserved with full care.

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Secretary of RSP and N. Moorthy, Secretary of CPI(ML) addressed the session of the left parties.

After this special session, first delegate session of the Party Congress began. The Central

On 24th February, morning, Delegate session started at 9.00am. The delegates from different states started to place their opinion and suggestions on the report and resolutions placed by the General Secretary. Special Session with Foreign Fraternal Delegates started at 11.00 am. Mr.Chen Jianjun and Kou Kai (Communist Party of China), Mr. Nguyen Thanh Hai (Communist Party of Vietnam), Ms. Rojas Medina Malena (Communist Party of Cuba), Mr. Chole Hui Chol and Mr. Kim Myong Chol (Workers' Party of Korea), Mr. Uday Raj Pandey and Mr. Yuvaraj Baskota (Communist Party of Nepal UML), Mr. Bimal

Rathnayake (People's Liberation Front of Sri Lanka), Mr. Vanmany Bounmy (Lao People's Revolutionary Party), Mr. Dibalok Singh and Mr. Ashraful Alam (Communist Party of Bangladesh), Mr. Saiful Huq and Ms. Bahnishika Jamali (Revolutionary Workers' Party of Bangladesh) addressed the Delegate Session of the Party Congress. The speakers of different Communists and Socialist parties univocally opined that the Socialist movement against the exploitation of capitalist machinations across the world should be strengthened. They also stated that a few corporates are controlling the lion share of world wealth at the cost of common people. Corporates are accumulating wealth with the covert and overt support from the ruling cliques throughout the world. Corporates are now controlling many governments and taking advantages of even the pandemic situations also. Com. G. Devarajan has conducted the session on behalf of the Presidium. The fraternal delegates were felicitated by the Central Secretariat Members and the leaders of Agragami Mahila

Samity.

The delegate Session continued till 25th February 8.00 pm. On 26th February at 9.00 am, the concluding session was held. Com. G.R. Shivashankar, Convener of the Credential Committee placed the Credential report of the Delegates. Com. Debabrata Biswas explained about the clarifications and explanations sought by the delegates on various political resolutions and organizational issues. After his explanation, the resolutions were adopted. The Constitutional Amendments adopted by the National Council Meeting held at Bhubaneshwar on 8th and 9th April 2022 was also placed before the Party Congress and approved by the Delegates.

404 Delegates from 19 states have been participated. 84 Delegates from different states participated in the discussion.

The Party Congress has emphatically resolved that when all other 'isms' have been miserably failed to resolve the basic issues of India, the time has come to revisit the socio-political-economic ideals of Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose. Therefore, the battle cry is "SUBHASISM IS THE FUTURE"

On the basis of the discussions and explanations held in the Delegate Session, the following decisions have been adopted by the Party Congress:-

1. The Party will unleash a nationwide campaign to popularize the theme of the Party Congress – “Subhasism Is The Future”
2. The Party units will start a door-to-door campaign on Netaji under the banner of

3. The Party units will take special initiatives to increase the party membership and to form more lower level party units.

8. The Party will strive for making contact with more socialist movements across the world.

9. The Party will try to explore the possibility of making a united platform of left-democratic-secular forces at national level.

10. More literature on “Subhasism” and other contemporary political issues will be published regularly.

11. The Party will organize country wide mass movement against price rise, unemployment, illiteracy, ill-health, issues of the farmers, workers and tribals.



THE FORWARD BLOC PARTY CONGRESS CALLS FOR LEFT, SECULAR AND DEMOCRATIC UNITY



The 19th Party Congress of All India Forward Bloc univocally calls for left-secular democratic unity against the communal and divisive ruling clique. While addressing the Special Session of the Party Congress, the leaders of CPI (M), CPI, RSP and CPI (ML) opined that the time has come to strengthen united action against the anti-people policies of the Union government.

The text of speech made by Com. Subhasini Ali Ex.M.P and Polit Bureau Member of Communist Party of India (Marxist) is given below: Message of Greetings to the 19th Congress of the All India Forward Bloc Comrades of the presidium, General Secretary Debabrata Biswas, delegates and guests.

On behalf of the Central Committee of the Communist Party of India (Marxist), I extend warm greetings to all the delegates attending the 19th Congress of the All India Forward Bloc.

Your Congress is being held at a critical juncture in India's political history. 75 years after independence, the country is being ruled by a regime, which is aggressively pursuing the Hindutva agenda of the fascist RSS. The nearly nine years of the Modi government have also seen the pursuit of pernicious neo-liberal policies, the promotion of Adani-style crony capitalism and the loot of national assets. The

Hindutva-corporate nexus has resulted in the imposition of a full-fledged authoritarianism marked by growing fascistic attacks.

The process of implementing the RSS agenda of a Hindutva 'Rashtra' is underway. To accomplish this, the Modi government is undermining the foundations of the secular-democratic Constitution. All the institutions under the Constitution are sought to be subverted from within.

After the Modi government came back to power in the 2019 Lok Sabha elections, the assault on the Constitution and democratic rights were intensified. The abrogation of Article 370 and dismantling of the state of Jammu & Kashmir, the passage of the Citizenship (Amendment) Act all marked the beginning of an intensified assault on the Constitution and the rights of citizens.

The period saw a more naked pursuit of pro-corporate and anti-working class policies. The Modi government has embarked on a large-scale privatization of public sector enterprises and made more concessions to big business. The four labor codes, which deprived vital rights of the working class, were enacted. The now-aborted three farm laws were also designed to help the corporates to penetrate the agricultural sector.

The so-called nationalist Hindutva forces have proved

to be the most consistent pro-imperialist forces too. The Modi government has emerged as a strategic and political ally of the United States of America with a burgeoning military alliance and becoming a member of the Quad.

The result of the pro-corporate, pro-rich economic policies is the steady deterioration in the living conditions of the people. After the travails of the Covid pandemic, the people are suffering from high unemployment, continuous inflation and rising prices and the effects of the agrarian crisis. The callous approach of the Modi government is seen by the recent budget proposals, wherein the allocation for the MGNREGA has been slashed by 33 per cent from the amount spent the previous year.

The Hindutva regime has meant ceaseless attacks on minorities and they are being deprived of the basic rights as citizens, particularly in the BJP-ruled states. Anti-cow slaughter laws, laws against conversion, the so-called 'love jihad' and bulldozer politics are used to target Muslims in the BJP-ruled states. Hindutva vigilante groups attack the minority communities often with the connivance of the administration and the police. Retrograde Manuvadi ideology promotes patriarchal, communal and

casteist practices, due to which women are subject to increased oppression and sexual attacks. Dalits and adivasis are also victims of this Hindutva outlook.

The Hindutva forces have tried to project themselves as 'nationalists' branding all those who oppose them as anti-national. Their assertion is paradoxical as both the RSS and the Hindu Mahasabha actively opposed the national movement. Naturally, there is not a single freedom fighter to be found in their ranks. As a result, they have been making desperate attempts to appropriate leaders of the national movement. Since Netaji, Subhas Chandra Bose, had differences with the leaders of the Congress, BJP leaders including the Prime Minister have made tremendous efforts to claim that it is they who are giving him his due. As proof of this, the Government has installed the statue of Netaji at India Gate where the statue of George V once stood. The false claims of the BJP leaders must be exposed. The Hindu Mahasabha criticized Netaji while he was in the Congress and also when he left it and went on to form the Indian National Army.

Savarkar, in fact, recruited soldiers for the British army at a time when the INA was fighting a bitter battle against the British. It was Netaji's firm and uncompromising commitment to secularism

that made him most unpalatable to the Hindu Mahasabha and he himself made no bones about his implacable opposition to the Mahasabha and its ideology. Exposing their false nationalism has to be part of our campaigns against the policies and actions of the BJP and Sangh Parivar.

The challenge before the Left and democratic forces in India is how to take on the Hindutva-corporate nexus and to mobilise all sections of the working people to fight against the assaults of the neo-liberal policies and, at the same time, mount a struggle against the Hindutva-communal forces.

During the second term of the Modi government, there has been growing resistance to the attacks launched by the Modi government on different sections of the working people. The anti-CAA movement developed as a mass protest against the subversion of the Constitution and citizenship; the biggest and most prolonged struggle of the farmers ended in a historic victory with the repeal of the three farm laws; the working class is constantly protesting against the new labor codes and the privatization drive through a series of general strikes and sectoral struggles. The Left parties have been active in leading and participating in these various struggles.

What is required now is to build more powerful struggles based on the widest unity and united platforms of different sections of the people. The Left has also the important role of countering ideologically the Hindutva offensive and providing the wherewithal for uniting all the democratic and secular forces.

This situation calls for the

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strengthening of the Left. A strengthened and united Left is essential for an effective fight against the rightwing Hindutva offensive. Building the unity of all the democratic and secular forces will pave the way for a successful fight to defeat and isolate the BJP. We hope your Congress will discuss on how to strengthen Left unity, forge an effective Left and democratic alternative and build the widest unity of all democratic and secular forces against the Hindutva regime.

We wish the Congress all success in your deliberations and once again convey our warm fraternal greetings.

Dear Comrades and friends, Members of the Presidium Comrade Debabrata Biswas, General Secretary of All India Forward Bloc

Comrades of the fraternal delegates, At the outset let me express on behalf of the National Council of Communist Party of India our militant greetings to all Delegates participating the 19th Congress of the Forward Bloc.

Your Congress assumes serious significance as it is taking place in a period of crucial importance in the world history. We are grappled with an unprecedented urgency to address the imperative issues that confront humanity today. International socio political and economic arena is intensely charged with the surging capitalist greed for profit and the imperialist lust for power and dominance. Fascism, the tool of imperialism is surging again

and trying to find its deep roots. Global peace is in peril. Principles of social justice are in jeopardy. National sovereignties are eroded and threatened in the process of the capitalist integration. Environmental degradation has assumed dangerously devastating dimension. The world is at the dangerous cross roads.

Your Congress is taking place at a time in Hyderabad when opinions are sharply polarised and no continent is insulated from wars or its consequences. Shortages, price- rise and extreme inequalities are making life difficult for a majority of people. Forced migration, destruction of natural resources and loss of habitat are radically altering lives and it is not for the better. The COVID-19 pandemic exposed before everyone how sharp the divisions of class have become across the globe. While some monopolies amassed billions, tens of millions lost their livelihoods and fell into extreme poverty. WHO admitted that the number of undernourished people which is nearly 700 million can increase by over 130 million and half of the planet's 3.3 billion workforce suffered. These developments have exposed the harsh reality of growth-claims under neo-liberalism.

Dear friends,

Imperialism is desperate to dig its feet deep into the ground. Imperialism is seeing a setback to its gigantic dominance. Struggles for democracies, resurgence of peoples movements against neo liberal economic policies, protests against racism etc have stripped naked the most brutal system of imperialism. US imperialism is facing apparent failures - the loss of Afghanistan, the failure of the CIA attempted coup in Khazakhstan and Cuba and

the continuing war between Russia and Ukraine despite the threat of the Europe and the NATO allies. The ongoing conflict in Europe has brought to the fore the nefarious agenda of imperialists led by the United States and mobilised under the war-machinery of NATO. Continuation of occupation and ongoing aggressions against the people of Palestine should be condemn by all and to support their just cause for an independent Palestinian state with 1967 border and the East Jerusalem as its Capital. Present De-escalation of tensions in all regions should be stopped since the conflict can snowball in greater magnitudes and can unfold unthinkable miseries for not only the habitants but for the entire world.

Latin America throws an unprecedented challenge to the US hegemony. A second left wing progressive wave is sweeping in Latin America, changing the geopolitical winds. The Bolivarian revolution has resisted and defeated the designs of counter revolution of the US imperialism marked by the economic sanctions, instigated coups and the hybrid wars. Bolivians defeated US imperialism with democratic means in the general elections against the US backed coup d'etat. Brazil, the largest democracy in Latin America has elected Lula da Silva in the recent elections against all the dirty tricks of the US to forge in its puppet government. Congratulations to the revolutionary people of Brazil.

But a wounded tiger is more dangerous. Ironically, the weak and vulnerable imperialism has entered a more dangerous phase of destruction. It is attempting to shore up its declining economic dominance and to

strengthen its general military presence around the globe. Its war machine is over working like never before in history.

Dear Comrades,

After the global financial meltdown of 2008, the failure of capitalism in uplifting the lives of the people became evident. Unemployment and inequality became more visible than ever after the crisis. However, the anxieties created by the spread and failure of neo- liberal capitalism were not tapped into by progressive forces barring a few notable exceptions. This allowed right-wing forces to consolidate and emerge as major political forces in many countries. Failure of neo-liberalism is being covered up by dividing people. The right has fuelled xenophobia, communalism, racism and strife keep the people divided. Expressions of hyper-nationalism and fundamentalism are getting uglier by the day and creating walls of hatred among people. The rise of right-wing is a threat to world peace and we must put up strong resistance to it by uniting people for harmony and a better future.

In this global context holding of the 19th Congress of AIFB assume significant importance in the political life of India.

Dear Comrades,

Keeping in step with the global phenomenon of neo-liberal economic feature of imperialism driven capitalism, India, too, has fallen in the mire of several crises. A second-time landslide victory for the BJP-RSS led the NDA forces has tightened the grip of fascism over the subcontinent.

This variant of fascism, however, should not be wholly equated with the fascism we have experienced in Italy, Germany, Spain or China. It is fascism of Indian

type where a union is fostered between regressive ideologies emerging from backward forces of production and imperialism-backed speculative capital of lumpen nature. The NDA government with Narendra Modi at its helm has been championing this fascist creed since assuming office after the debacle of the second UPA government.

Today, the Modi government has totally bogged down before the directives of the corporates and crony capitalists like the Reliance and the Adani Group. It is selling off all profitable public enterprises for a mess of pottage and thereby breaking down the backbone of our national economy. Seems, the Modi-Shah nexus has already taken the decision of compromising with the nation's independence by leasing out the economic sovereignty of the country to corporate and multinationals. On the other hand, it has taken calculated steps to inflict upon the people tremendous misery by bringing ever newer exploitative bills and amending the acts. By amending the essential commodities act, it has pushed our countrymen to the brink of destruction. It has also declared a war against the lower and middle income groups by gradually compromising the banking sector. The peasantry and the working class of India are also thrashed to the wall by enactment of different anti-peasant, anti-working class measures. Farmers' suicide resulting from reduction in subsidy, perpetual indebtedness and non-materialisation of MSP-has become a mainstay of Indian agriculture.

The BJP-led NDA government is proceeding in a slow but steady pace to

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establish its totalitarian rule all over the country. In this hegemonic endeavour it is not only applying force but also a very organised propaganda in the media-which they have already purchased.

By raising a hue and cry over the "double engine" theory, and equating it with the concept of pseudo development, the Modi government, in the shrewdest possible way, is gradually jeopardizing the federal structure of India-both fiscal and political.

In achieving its malicious ends, the BJP has launched an all-out attack against the Constitution. The dismemberment of Jammu and Kashmir into three mutually exclusive pieces by adopting the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganisation Act, 2019 and revoking Article 370 is nothing but a gross violation of our constitutional norms.

The BJP government in this way is not only striving to break down the economic sovereignty and the federal



structure of the country, but also the bond of commonness and brotherhood among the people. It has picked up the politics of divide and rule, primarily introduced by the British colonial power in pre-47 period to suit its goal. The BJP-RSS fascists, whose two most revered idols-Savarkar and Syamaprasad-were blatant British lackeys, have thus rejuvenated the Savarkarian two-nation theory of communal divide thereby meticulously tearing apart the secular fabric of the nation.

But since every anti-people

pronouncement and policy of the government is meeting popular resistance big or small, the government has started trampling on the fundamental rights of the Indian citizens, conferred upon them by the constitution of India. It has introduced several draconian laws and strictures to restrict the voice of dissent.

The draft resolution of 19th Congress correctly assesses about the present situation. But now question is how to replace these communal fascist forces from the power

and save our secular democratic polity.
